All exhibits in this department must be in place before 12 Noon on Tuesday and will remain on display for the duration of the fair. Exhibits will not be released before 4pm on Sunday.

REMINDER: All livestock will show on Thursday of fair week. Sheep Show at 9:00am, followed by the Meat Goats, Swine Show, and Beef Show.

There are a limited number of 6 x 6 pens on the fairgrounds. All pens will be assigned on first come first serve basis, **BY CALLING SUPERINTENDENT.**

1. All exhibitors must keep their area clean. On the close of the fair, all exhibitors must clean their area or forfeit all premiums.
2. Any exhibitor's non-sportsmanlike conduct will forfeit all premiums and show privileges for the next year as determined by the Fair Board.
3. Registered stock must be in name of exhibitor or immediate family at least 30 days prior to the entry of the exhibit. Immediate family means father, mother, brother, sister.
4. All registration papers must be available anytime, upon request of Superintendent.
5. Stock with no registration papers must be shown in commercial class.
6. All animals shown in group classes must be shown in individual class.
7. No animal to be removed from grounds without permission of Superintendent or Fair Board.
8. Exhibitors must consult Superintendent about placing animals.
9. All entries must be brought out of the pens to show. Failure to do this will cause forfeit of prizes.
10. No person will be allowed to interfere with the Judge during the show or any time before. If any person attempts to interfere with the Judge, he or she will be excluded from competition and will lose premiums. Protest must be made to the Superintendent.
11. The decision of the Judge is final unless there is an error, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion not discovered at the time of the Award is proven. In such cases, the Superintendent and Fair Board will make a decision. Their decision is final.
12. The Judge may reject or refuse any exhibit of sheep, beef or swine, which in his or her opinion, is not worthy of showing, or representative of the Breed.
13. 4-H members are eligible to enter open class immediately following their show, if their animals have placed within the top three animals of their class (entry fee, exhibitor number to be given to show clerk).
14. ANIMALS SHOWN IN BREEDING CLASS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR MARKET CLASS.
15. HAY and BEDDING WILL NOT be furnished to exhibitors by the Fair Association.
16. Campers and tents may be permitted in area designated by grounds and/or Superintendent. REQUEST FOR PERMISSION TO PLACE TENT OR CAMPER ON THE FAIR GROUNDS MUST BE INCLUDED WITH LIVESTOCK ENTRY. Fair Board may refuse any tent or camper to park.
17. The person's name that is on the entry form must show the animal in the show ring, unless they have more than one animal in that class or have permission of Superintendent.
18. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED IN THE LIVESTOCK BARNs.. MISCONDUCT TOWARD PERSONAL PROPERTY AND/OR EXHIBIT WILL LEAD TO EXCLUSION FROM FUTURE COMPETITION AND LOSS OF PREMIUMS AS DETERMINED BY THE FAIR BOARD.
19. No exhibitor will receive more than two premiums in any one class.
20. Sheep premiums not to exceed more than \$1,200.00, but may be limited to \$700.00 if entries do not warrant the full amount. Premiums to be paid by Chenango County Fair to Exhibitors will increase as the size of the classes increase, up to 10 entries in a class.
21. Any panels broken by exhibitor's animals must be repaired or replaced by exhibitor at their expense. Failure to do so will mean repair fee being deducted from premium check.
22. Entries close on Friday, July 29, NO ENTRIES WILL BE TAKEN AFTER THE DEADLINE (No entries taken on day of show).
23. Substitutions are allowed within breed only.
24. Premiums will be determined using a point system.

CLASSES FOR SECTION 1 – 23

Classes are divided by the following and are the same for all breeds:

- Junior Lambs – born on or after 2/16 current year
- Intermediate Lambs – born 1/1 – 2/15 current year
- Senior Lambs – born 9/1 – 12/31 previous year
- Junior Yearling Ewes – born 1/1 – 8/31 previous year
- Senior Yearling Ewes – 9/1 – 12/31, to be 12-24 months of age

 20. Mixed Pair, junior aged animals, 1 male, 1 female
- *Supreme Champion Ram & Supreme Champion Ewe – all breed champion rams & ewes to compete.

SECTION 24 - Market Lambs (to be shown on Thursday following the beef show)

No market lamb will be shown with more than 1 inch of wool. All market lambs to be born since January 1 of current year and shorn within the last 30 days of show.

Market Classes

Class:

21. Light Weight Market Lamb – under 70lbs, no intact males
22. Medium Weight Market Lamb – 71-85 lbs, no intact males
23. Heavy Weight Market Lamb – over 85lbs, no intact males
24. Pair of Market Lambs – no intact males

SECTION 25 - Wool Fleece Class

Exhibitor may enter not more than two fleeces per class from sheep owned by him/her. All fleeces will have been shorn since December of the previous year. Fleeces should be rolled with skin side out and placed in a clear plastic bag. Fleeces may be opened by Judge. EACH FLEECE MUST BE TAGGED SECURELY WITH THE NAME OF THE BREED AND EXHIBITOR'S SHOW NUMBER (NOT exhibitor's name and address)

Fleece will be rejected if it shows paint or tar, has excess foreign matter, weak staple, or broken fiber. Fleeces to be displayed in Harry L. Case Building or sheep barn, as space permits.

Judge and Judging time to be announced.

Class:

10. Med. Wool Columbia, Corriedale, Targhee, Southdown, Oxford, Tunis, Hampshire, Suffolk, Shropshire, Dorset, Cheviot & Montadle and their crosses.
11. Fine Wool Finnish, Landrace, Delaine-Merino, Rambouillet, Debouillet and their crosses.
12. Long Wool Leicester, Lincoln, Romney, Border, Leicester, Cotswold and their crosses.
13. Naturally Colored Wool - Fine
14. Naturally Colored Wool - Medium
15. Naturally Colored Wool - Coarse

SECTION 26 - Llama and Alpaca Fiber

The fiber submitted for judging will be from a full barrel shear (a full barrel shear is the prime fiber located behind the shoulder line and extending to a point approximating the line of the pelvic bone; both sides of the barrel shear should be included). It should be shorn within the past year (from date of show). Each entry must be tagged with the name of the breed and exhibitor's name.

Classes:

1. Fiber from single coated llamas under 2 years of age as of date of show.
2. Fiber from single coated llamas over 2 years of age as of date of show.
3. Fiber from double coated llamas under 2 years of age as of date of show.
4. Fiber from double coated llamas over 2 years of age as of date of show.
5. Fiber from alpacas under 2 years of age as of date of show, white in color.
6. Fiber from alpacas over 2 years of age as of date of show, white in color.
7. Fiber from alpacas under 2 years of age as of date of show, grey or black in color.
8. Fiber from alpaca over 2 years of age as of date of show, grey or black in color.
9. Fiber from alpaca under 2 years of age as of date of show, brown or red in color.
10. Fiber from alpaca over 2 years of age as of date of show, brown or red in color.

MEAT GOATS

Section 27

BREEDING ANIMALS

Rules:

1. Doe kids and does must be either 1) tattooed and accompanied by matching registration papers indicating their age, or 2) must be judged on age by their teeth (no adult teeth <1 yr.; 1 set adult teeth = 1 year old and under 2; >1 set adult teeth = 2 yrs. Or older.
2. Classes may be further divided by breed, age, or weight at the judge's direction.

Premiums will be determined using the point system. The number of points for each class are:

1st	2nd	3rd	4th

Class:

1. Doe kids, 1-3 mons., born April 5 – June 5 current year.
2. Doe kids, 3-6 mons., born January 5 – April 4 current year.
3. Doe kids, 6-9 mons.
4. Doe kids, 9-12 mons.
5. Yearling Does, 12-18 mons., not kidded
6. Yearling Does, 18-24 mons., not kidded
7. 2-yr-old Does, 24-30 mons., & kidded
8. 2-yr-Old Does, 30-36 mons, and kidded

9. Aged Does, 3 years & over
 10. Best Pair Does, any age
 11. Produce of Dam, 2 Does with the same Dam
 12. Get of Sire, 3 Does with the same sire
 13. Breeders Herd, consisting of 5 animals, all owned by 1 owner/exhibitor

Market Classes:

14. Meat Goat Market Kid Class

- a. Goats can be either castrated male or female kids (no adult teeth).
- b. Any doe kid showing in this class may not show in class #66 and will be judged as a market animal.
- c. Class may be further subdivided by breed, weight, age, or sex of goat at the judge's discretion.
- d. Champion market kid will compete for overall champion market animal.

BEEF CATTLE

All beef MUST be exhibited in the beef barn. Beef not exhibited in the barn will not be allowed to show. IF the beef barn is at capacity, then exhibitors may house beef in another department. No bulls over 365 days of age as of show date.

Premiums to be paid by Chenango County Fair to exhibitors of Beef Cattle increase as the size of the classes increase up to 10 entries in a class. Premiums offered - \$400.00, but limited to \$200.00, as entries warrant.
 Commercial - any purebred beef without registration papers, grade, or beef cross-breed.
 All animals shown in group classes must be shown in individual classes.

Premiums will be determined using the point system. The number of points for each class are:

- 5 Summer Yearling Heifer born May 1, to August 31 of previous year

- 7 Heifer, not calved, born before Jan 1 of previous year
- 8 Cow freshened at least once
- 9 Get of Sire (3 animals, either sex, by one sire)

Animals will be taped or weighed on Tuesday to determine weigh breaks and class assignment. All group animals must show in individual classes. Market animals cannot be shown in breeding class except Get-of-Sire, and Produce of Dam.

SWINE

(to be shown on Thursday following beef show)

Premiums offered - \$400.00 and may be limited to \$200.00, as entries warrant. All group animals must show in individual classes with the exception of class II.

BOARS

1. Senior Fall Boar - farrowed on or after July 1st of the preceding year and before January 1st of current year
2. January Spring Boar - farrowed on or after January 1st and before February 1st of the current year
3. February Spring Boar - farrowed on or after February 1st and before March 1st of the current year
4. Junior Spring Boar - farrowed on or after March 1st of the current year
Champion Boar

GILTS

5. Senior Fall Gilt - farrowed after July 1st of the preceding year and before January 1st of the current year
6. January Spring Gilt - farrowed on or after January 1st and before February 1st of the current year
7. February Spring Gilt - farrowed on or after February 1st and before March 1st of the current year
8. Junior Spring Gilt - farrowed on or after March 1st of the current year
Champion Gilt
9. Pair of Gilts - born on or after January 1st of current year
10. Sow and litter - exhibitor must provide pen to ensure safety of sow & litter.

MARKETING DIVISION

11. Lightweight (class break to be determined after animals are weighed at fair)
12. Medium weight
13. Heavyweight
14. Pair of Market Pigs - pen shall consist of two barrows and/or gilts by the exhibitor
15. Pair of feeder Pigs - pen shall consist of two barrows and/or gilts owned by exhibitor not to exceed 60 lbs.
All animals shown in group classes must also be shown in individual classes.

CHAMPIONS

There will be a Supreme Champion of the Breeding Show and Supreme Champion of the Market Show, awarding ribbons only.
